Follow Booth Memorial Avenue to Main Street. *From the IRT Flushing Line #7:* train to Main Street (last stop), then Q44 bus southbound on Main Street; stops opposite the Hospital. NewYork-Presbyterian Queens is located in a residential area with metered parking. Free lock-and-park spaces are available under the Van Wyck Expressway at College Point Blvd. and 58th Road. Shuttle buses to the Hospital run approximately every 10-15 minutes. Limited paid parking is available in our Visitor Parking Lot located on Booth Memorial Avenue opposite the NewYork-Presbyterian Queens Emergency Room.

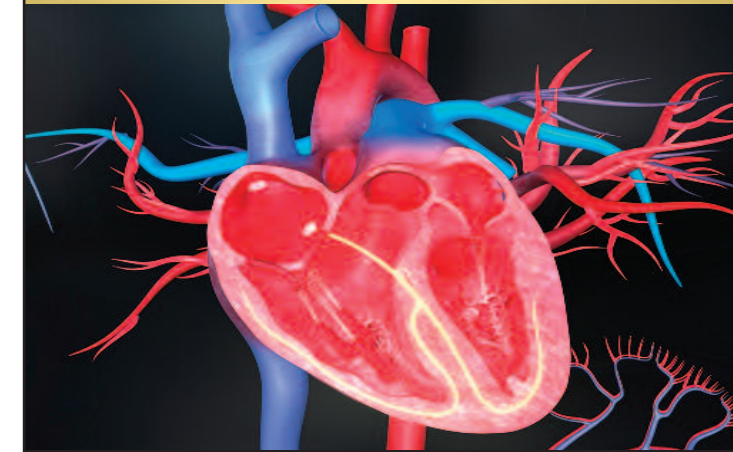

Statement of Need

Heart disease remains the number one killer in the United States in men and women despite remarkable advances in medical technology, pharmacotherapy, and research. Furthermore, the U.S. health care policies have a direct impact on how physicians practice today. Physicians require updates on the latest breakthroughs, information about controversial topics in cardiology and challenges that may arise in daily practice. This program will provide cardiologists and internists with the latest recommendations on management of key topics including lipids, stroke risk reduction in atrial fibrillation, cardiovascular disease management in women, new structural heart procedures such as transcatheter aortic valve replacement (TAVR), and transcatheter mitral valve repair, as well as the impact of health care payment reform through MACRA, and more. The Breakout Session will provide attendees with a unique opportunity to focus on topics of their own interest with case-based, hands-on learning experiences.

Target Audience

Primary Care Physicians, Cardiologists, Electrophysiologists, Fellows, Residents, Medical Students, Physician Assistants, Nurse Practitioners, Registered Nurses and all cardiac health care providers.
