

Statement of Need

The number of surviving infants born prematurely has increased significantly during the past decade, with many neonates born at earlier gestational ages. Cardiorespiratory problems continue to require greatest attention in the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU). This annual collaborative symposium will present emerging issues in perinatal health and evidence-based updates in neonatal medicine, highlighting transitional cardiorespiratory physiology, management of PPHN, and prevention/management of hospital acquired infections.

Target Audience

Neonatologists, Pediatricians, Obstetricians, Neonatal Nurse Practitioners, Neonatal Nurses, OB Physician Assistants, Neonatal Physician Assistants, Dietitians, Respiratory Therapists and Ethicists.

Educational Objectives

It is intended that this NYP/Queens CME activity will lead to improved patient care. At the conclusion of this symposium, the participant will be able to:

- ▶ Describe fetal physiology and transition at birth.
- ▶ Specify the role of oxygen in management of PPHN.
- ▶ Identify the choice of optimal pulmonary vasodilator therapy in PPHN.

- ▶ Discuss updates concerning strategies that decrease the incidence of HAI.

- ▶ Describe evidence from physiologic studies and clinical trials on Placental Transfusion for term and preterm infants.
- ▶ Discuss clinical issues relating to placental transfusion for term and preterm infants.
- ▶ Describe the physiology of circulatory function and failure in the newborn.
- ▶ Specify the mechanisms of action of the available inotropic medications.
- ▶ Develop a targeted approach to inotrope therapy.

NewYork-Presbyterian/Queens is located on the corner of Booth Memorial Avenue and Main Street in Flushing. *From the Long Island Expressway:* take the Main Street Exit (#23), travel north on Main Street to Booth Memorial Avenue. *From the Whitestone Bridge:* take the Van Wyck Expressway to the College Point Blvd. Exit; turn left on College Point Blvd. and right on Booth Memorial Avenue. Follow Booth Memorial Avenue to Main Street. *From the IRT Flushing Line #7:* train to Main Street (last stop), then Q44 bus southbound on Main Street; stops opposite the Hospital.
