Statement of Need

The number of surviving infants born prematurely has increased significantly during the past decade, with many neonates born at earlier gestational ages. Neonatal infections and oxygen targeting continue to require greatest attention in the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU). The incidence of neonatal sepsis remains high and the outcome is still severe. In order to provide optimal patient care, practitioners require the latest updates and recommendations impacting perinatal and neonatal health. Attendees at this symposium will have a unique opportunity to interact with leading experts in newborn medicine presenting current neonatal management issues and evidence-based updates. Topics include new recommendations for delivery room interventions, reappraisal of guidelines for management of early onset sepsis, late preterm infant care and oxygen targeting in preterm infants.

Neonatologists, Pediatricians, Obstetricians, Neonatal Nurse Practitioners, Neonatal Nurses, OB Physician Assistants, Neonatal Physician Assistants, Respiratory Therapists and Ethicists.
