Follow Booth Memorial Avenue to Main Street. *From the IRT Flushing Line #7:* train to Main Street (last stop), then Q44 bus southbound on Main Street; stops opposite the Hospital. NewYork-Presbyterian Queens is located in a residential area with metered parking. Free lock-and-park spaces are available under the Van Wyck Expressway at College Point Blvd. and 58th Road. Shuttle buses to the Hospital run approximately every 10-15 minutes.
